
Ten works to see at Classic Art London

The Miracle of the Jealous Husband in St Anthony's Church, Padua is by the

British designer William Kent (1685-1748). Found in a private collection in the US, it is priced at £15,000 by Duke Street dealer Alexander Clayton-Payne.

Inscribed verso *Da Titiano, Padoa, August 29 1714, W Kent*, this is one of a small group of surviving drawings made by Kent while he was studying, travelling and working in Italy (1709-19). In June 1714 he had embarked on a tour with Thomas Coke (1697-59), the future first Earl of Leicester and for whom Kent would design his architectural masterpiece, Holkham Hall. Diaries record their party had reached Padua on August 17. Only about 10 drawings survive from Kent's decade in Italy, and all but two are held in public collections.
